UPC Refugee Sponsorships Update on Abass and family

You'll remember that at the beginning of 2022, UPC started a process, in conjunction with the Refugee Sponsorship team at the Presbyterian Church in Canada office, to sponsor an Afghani family as refugee claimants to Canada.

The family – a husband, wife and two young adult children – is currently safely out of Afghanistan, living in Tajikistan as refugees – until Canada approves their refugee application to come to Canada.

On behalf of UPC, Randy Carr has been managing the refugee application. Working with Randy has been the co-sponsor of the application, Maryam Durani, who is the husband's sister – and Randy's next-door neighbour.

Thankfully, the application has successfully passed several milestones in the past 18 months, and is "on track". But there are still several milestones and perhaps 12 months to go before Canada provides the final approval and we can welcome Abass, Sosan, Ali Raze and Zainab to Canada.

A young Iraqi man was brought to our attention by the PCC in 2019. His family live here in Markham and Ali has been living in Jordan since he fled from Iraq. He is the last of his immediate family who has not yet made it to Canada. UPC agreed to be the co-sponsor with Ali's father, Yesri, and the process began. Under the guidance of the

Refugee Team of PWS&D the appropriate IRCC (Immigration, Refugee and Citizenship Canada) forms and conditions were completed. There have been numerous steps since then and in April, 2023, Ali was approved for settlement in Canada. The last piece that needs to happen is for him to undergo a medical examination. As you can well imagine, his mother and father, Mouroj and Yesri, are anxious for this to take place. We hope and pray that this will happen very soon.

Urwah's Journey

Thank you for all your prayers, Urwah returned to Canadian soil on Sunday, July 16 after being in Palestine/Israel for 10 days. The brutally hot weather and the experiences she had encountered have exhausted Urwah physically and emotionally. However, this is what Urwah had told Presbyterian Canada upon her return:

"The JAI program was absolutely amazing and is a trip of a lifetime. Ibrahim and his team did an amazing job at educating us, organizing and planning our days. There was a perfect amount of education and leisure time. I met some amazing people from all throughout the world including the local Palestinians themselves. I would more than recommend this opportunity as it was really eye-opening for us and made us realize the amount of sufferings that Palestinians go through on a regular basis and this trip provided us with the education to allow us to come back and spread the word. I highly recommend this trip as I feel there is a lack of knowledge on this conflicting issue, I myself plan on going back next summer. I have made friends and a family for a lifetime in Palestine, it is a beautiful country with kind-hearted people who don't even hesitate for one second when it comes to generosity despite all the sufferings that occur in their lives daily."

Urwah is hoping to become the voice of the Palestinians and is working on a presentation to share her experiences with us and other churches in the near future.

May God bless Urwah with strength and wisdom to become the spokesperson of the voiceless Palestinians.
