In his letter to the believers in Galatia, the Apostle Paul wrote, "When the fullness of time had come, God sent his son..." (Gal. 4:4).

4 to 1 Matching Donations to Markham Food Bank!

In the spirit of UPC's Hope in Action mission 'to make a positive difference through engaging with the wider community in acts of compassion and service', an anonymous donor is offering to match donations to the Markham Food Bank 4 to 1, with the target of reaching \$20,000 in total.

This generous offer has been presented by the donor as a way of bringing a benefit to our community that may have been achieved with the \$20,000 of HIA dollars that was used to support our operations finances, and which loan was recently voted to forgive by the congregation.

For example: \$10 with matching donation becomes \$50, \$100 becomes \$500, \$1,000 becomes \$5,000. This matching offer will continue until the total reaches \$20,000 (e.g. \$4,000 in donations with \$16,000 in matched donations = \$20,000; \$8,000 in donations with \$12,000 in matched donations = \$20,000).

The timeframe begins now and will end Feb. 22, the last Sunday in February.

We are truly blessed that out of these regrettable circumstances something good has come. Please Note: Donations to this program must be made through UPC, marked "Markham Food Bank", for privacy, verification and summation purposes.



Active Waiting

Most of us consider waiting as something very passive, a hopeless state determined by events totally out of our hands. The bus is late? We cannot do anything about it, so we have to sit there and just wait. It is not difficult to understand the irritation people feel when somebody says, "Just wait." Words like that push us into passivity.

But there is none of this passivity in Scripture. Those who are waiting are waiting very actively. They know that what they are waiting for is growing from the ground on which they are standing. Right here is a secret for us about waiting. If we wait in the conviction that a seed has been planted and that something has already begun, it changes the way we wait. Active waiting implies being fully present to the moment with the conviction that something is happening where we are and that we want to be present to it. A waiting person is someone who is present to the moment, believing that this moment is the moment.



As of this writing, we will be sitting in a surplus position at year end which is an incredible blessing. Thank you all for your prayerful support.

An Update on our Sponsored Refugee Family: Abass, Sosan, Ali Reza and Zainab

You'll remember that after four years of applying and waiting, our sponsored Afghani refugee family arrived safely in Toronto in September. Parents Abass and Sosan, and young adult children Ali Reza and Zainab joined us a few weeks later at a UPC Sunday service to eloquently say thank you for our support and their new life opportunity.

Since then, the family has been living with family members in Richmond Hill and trying to figure out which way is up. Abass has been looking for employment (he has considerable experience as a baker and a tailor, but at the moment has little command of English), Ali Reza is participating in two daily ESL classes and working in the evenings, Zainab is a full-time student at an adult school in Richmond Hill, aiming for her Canadian high school diploma as quickly as possible (and higher education after that), and the mother, Sosan, is the homemaker, staying with the Farsi-speaking family members.

Although the Canadian bureaucratic paths have been challenging, there have indeed been paths, and the family has successfully obtained their permanent residence credentials and Ontario health cards, among others.

And as well as financial support from the family, UPC has been able to assist with some Presto card bus passes and a generous amount of winter clothing. Much of the clothing – from UPC and Celebration and some church friends – fits! And anything that didn't fit will be delivered to a community services centre in Toronto that specializes in helping new refugee families. The bus passes have helped Abass as he travels to job opportunities, Ali Reza to one of his ESL classes (he can walk to the other), and Zainab to school.

If you have any suggestions re employment opportunities for Abass, please let me or Julie know.
